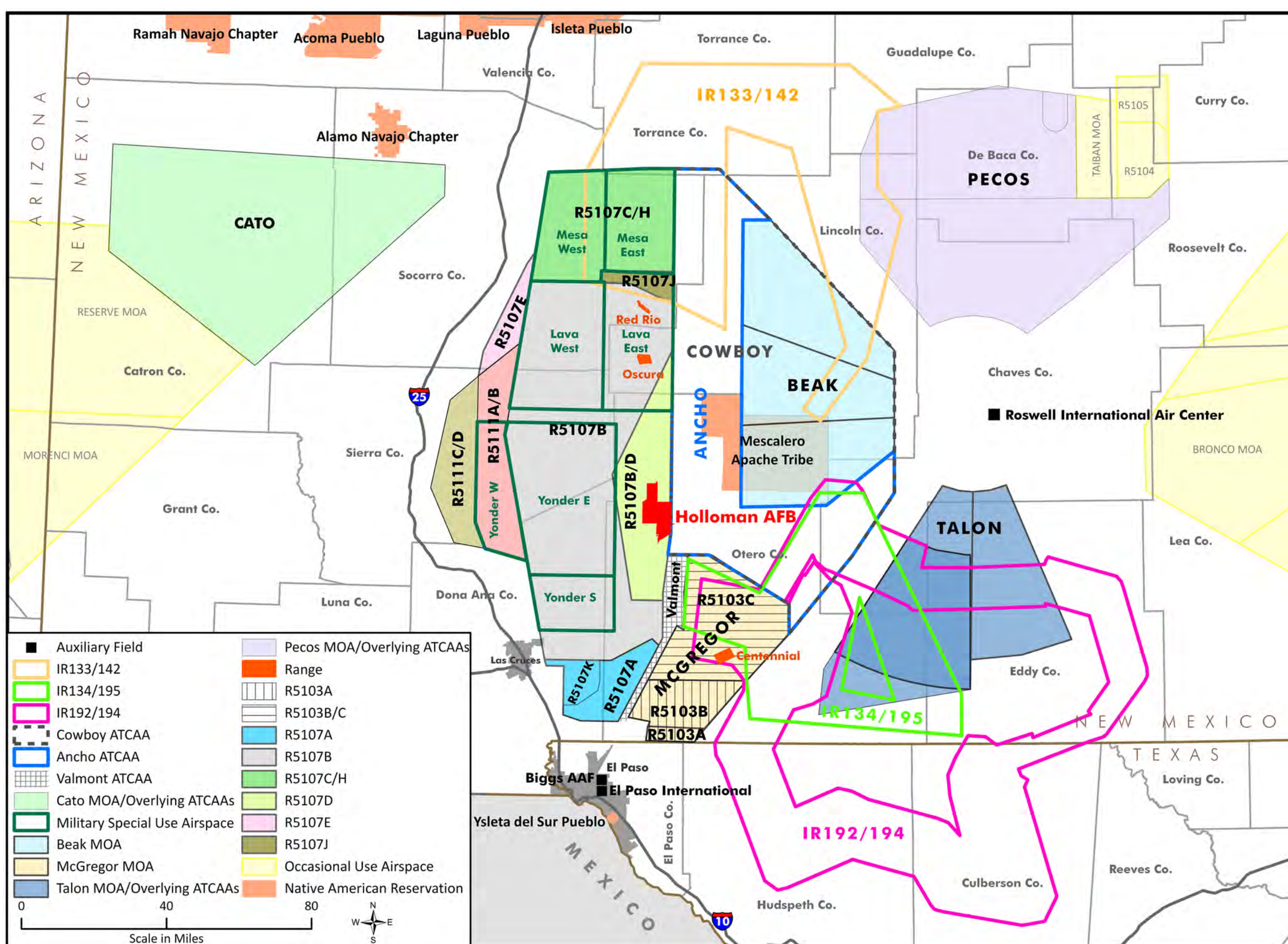
HOLLOMAN AIR FORCE BASE



Holloman Air Force Base (AFB) is one of four alternative installations analyzed in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement for establishment of a Pilot Training Center and associated basing of F-35A training aircraft.

Holloman AFB:

- Is home to the 49th Wing, German Air Force training and various test programs.
- Is home to MQ-9, MQ-1, QF-4, F-16, T-38A and Tornado (German Air Force) aircraft operations.
- Supports approximately 21,000 active duty, reserve and National Guard personnel; retirees; Department of Defense civilians; and family members.
- Developed facilities and infrastructure for stealth fighter aircraft in the 1990s.
- Uses training airspace associated with White Sands Missile Range, Centennial Range, McGregor Range, large overland Military Operations Areas and Air Traffic Control Assigned Airspace.
- Provides local air-to-ground training for military aircraft.
