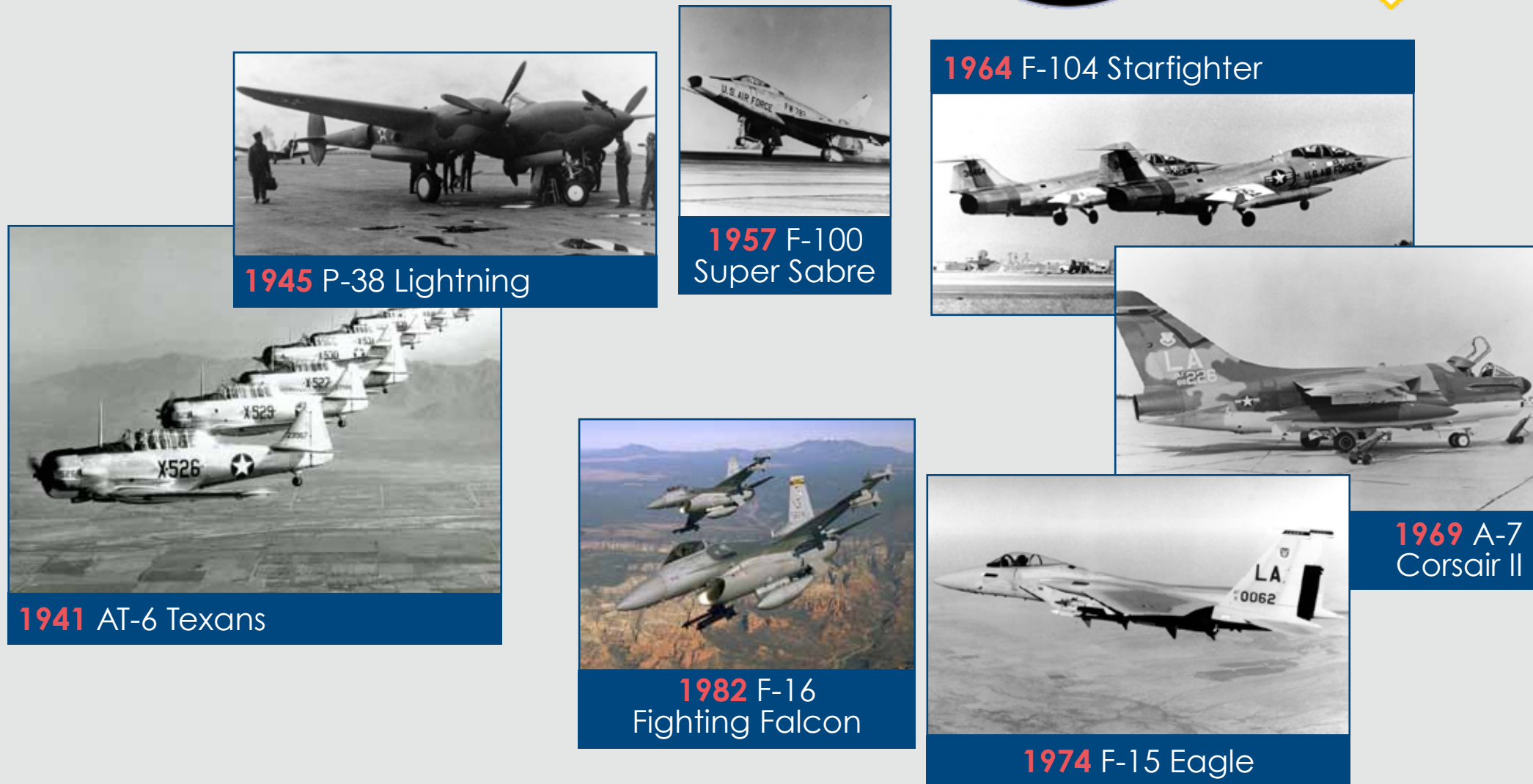
LUKE AIR FORCE BASE

Luke Air Force Base (AFB) is one of four alternative installations analyzed in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement for establishment of a Pilot Training Center and associated basing of F-35A training aircraft.

Aerial shot of Luke Air Force Base in 1941

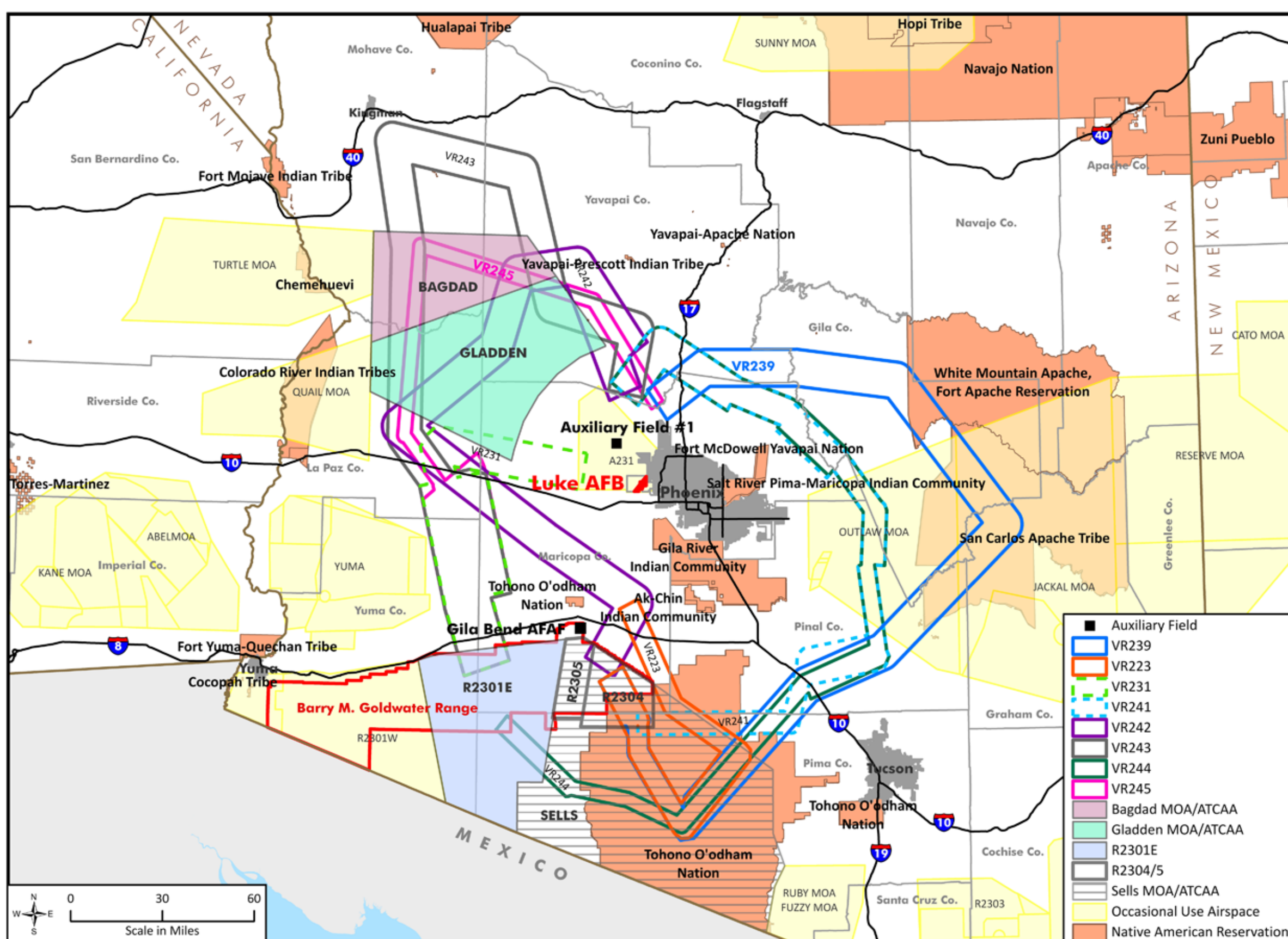


Aerial shot of Luke Air Force Base today



Luke AFB:

- Has been home to generations of fighter aircraft and pilot training since 1941.
- Is home to the Air Force's 56th Fighter Wing.
- Is the largest and only active duty F-16 training wing in the Air Force, training more than 50 percent of the Air Force's fighter pilots and 90 percent of its F-16 pilots.
- Includes the Barry M. Goldwater Range, an integral component of the training mission.
- Supports active duty, reserve and National Guard combat pilots from all four military services.
